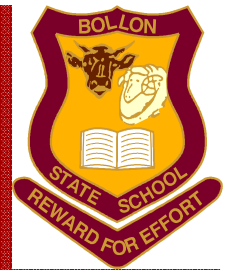



And new funding means parents of both younger children and teenagers can continue to access specialised Triple P programs anywhere in Queensland, online or in person.

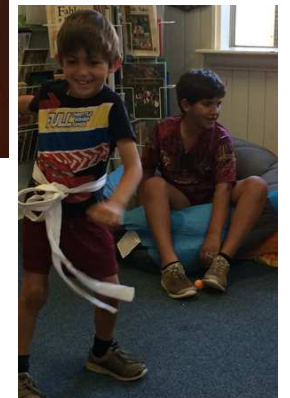
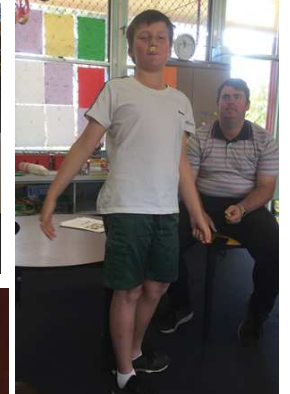
