This fortnight, we have learnt the letter 'x' and has taken us on a pirate exploration where we have used 'X' to 'mark the spot'. We made a pirate map and used our knowledge of using symbols on maps. We also revised letter 'w' and made some watermelons.

We have been working on our number recognition and now our children are using numbers 1-20 and recognising their numeral form.

We have been reading a number of stories this fortnight about pets and have discussed how we care for our pets; and we painted a picture of our pet at home.

We explored NAIDOC week and read a number of Indigenous stories. We did paintings of "when the snake bites the sun' and made an echidna out of clay.

We have been joining prep-2 students in their science lessons on Thursdays and we have explored sound and things that make sound such as musical instruments and everyday things in our environment; such as machinery; animals and weather.

## **HASS and Science Update**

## Science News

#### This term in Science...

**Prep – year 2** students are exploring sources of sound and light. They will be manipulating materials to observe how sound and light are produced and how changes can be made to light and sound effects. The year 1 -2 students will be challenged in their assessment task to make their own musical instrument. If you have any construction materials such as shoe boxes or small containers or cardboard boxes that you would be happy to donate to the school to support the children in this experience, please send them in with your child in the next couple of weeks.

Year 3 – 4 students have been investigating the transfer of heat and light energy. The students will be conducting an investigation into the behaviour of heat to explain everyday observations and describe how science investigations can be used to respond to questions. They have been using thermometers and discussing how heat energy can transfer to other objects.

Year 5-6 students will plan, predict and conduct an investigation about the transfer of light and describe how scientific developments affect people's lives and help solve problems. We have discussed how light can be absorbed, reflected, transferred or refracted. The assessment task for this term will have students creating a light maze, so if you have a spare shoebox you would be happy to donate, please send it to school with your child.

Thank you for your support in your child's learning. We are looking forward to our scientific adventures this term.

## HASS News

#### This Semester in HASS...

Prep students will explore special familiar places and how to care for them. Years 1 and 2 students identify, represent and describe the features of places, their location at a local scale and describe how places can be cared for. We have been working on identifying places on a personal, local or regional scale. We have also been creating models of special places and creating maps of different places from an aerial view (bird's eye view). We will also be exploring ways people take care of places to maintain and preserve them for years to come.

Years 3-4 students, will be investigating and comparing places and conducting a waste management inquiry. They will be comparing Australia and another country and analysing the similarities and differences. They will then be conducting a 'waste survey' and analysing and interpreting data on this issue.

Years 5–6 students will be creating an information guide comparing Australia and Indonesia. They will be investigating the diverse characteristics of these two countries to create an information guide for exchange students. They will then compare business proposals to select a proposal for a vacant block of land, which has the most benefit for a fictitious community.

Across all years we have been looking at maps and their features. You could assist your child's learning about maps by exposing them to their use in everyday life. By finding your house on google maps, using GPS in your car or by finding places on a world map you may have at home.


